Licence is hereby granted under and subject to the provisions of the U.P. Excise Act, 1910 (Act IV of 1910) and the rules and order made thereunder to cancellation of licence ----- of -----
----- (hereinafter referred to as Licensee) **authorising** him to store in bond, Indians made foreign liquor at ----- in the district -----(hereinafter called the licensed premises 0 during the period commencing on -----and ending on 31st March, 19 (both days inclusive) subjects to the following conditions, in the action of which either by the licensee or any person in his employ may entail on the licensee imposition of penalty, forfeiture of security and cancellation of licence.

CONDITIONS

1. The licensee shall pay into the Government treasury in advanced a sum of Rs. 2,00,000/- (Rs. Two Lakhs) as licence fees and shall also furnish a security of Rs. 25,000/- (Rs. Twenty –five thousand) as provided under the rules on the subject.
2. Issues of foreign liquor from the said Bonded Warehouse shall be made either in bond to any other Bonded Warehouse in the state or on payment of duty to the wholesales vendors of foreign liquor of the State.
3. Issues of foreign liquor from the said Bonded Warehouse shall be made at such strengths only as may be fixed from time to time by the Excise Commissioner, U.P.
4. The Officer Incharge of the Bonded Warehouse is empowered to stop with the sanction of the Deputy/Assistant Excise Commissioner of the Charge concerned, pending the orders of the Excise Commissioner, the issues of foreign liquor which he considers bad and is required to send samples of such foreign liquor for analysis without delay.
5. The licensee shall maintain such minimum stock of each brand at the warehouse as may be fixed by the Deputy/Assistant Excise Commissioner of the Charge keeping in view the demand and requirements of the particular brands by the retail vendors.
6. The licensee shall be responsible for the proper unkeep and storage of foreign liquor at the Warehouse. The licensee shall provided adequate number of racks, almirahs, boxes and other equipment as may be necessary for storing his stocks and shall be at liberty to put his own lock thereon.
7. The licensee shall supply Indian made foreign liquor in bottles of 750mls., 375mls, and 180mls, capacity only and beer in bottles of 650mls, and 325mls.
8. The labels affixed to the bottles shall have the prescribed labels.
9. The licensee will be required to post his authorised Agent duly approved by the Deputy/Assistant Excise Commissioner of the Charge and shall arrange for the loading and unloading of his incoming consignments of indian made foreign liquor and issues from the Bonded Warehouse.

10. The licensee shall be keep in the bonded Warehouse a true and correct account of the quantity of foreign liquor received, issued and held in balance at such bonded warehouse. The account shall be correctly written upto-date daily in a register in prescribed form. Pages of the Account Register shall be numbered and sealed with a rubber seal of concerned District Excise Officer. Passes and Counterfoils of the passes covering the receipts and issues of foreign liquor shall be property kept and shall at all times be open to inspection by the authorities of Excise Department.
11. The licensee shall be bound by all the general rules for the management of the Bonded Warehouse and for the issues of foreign liquor therefrom.
12. The licensee shall abide by the conditions of this licence and provisions of The U.P. Excise Act, 1910 and the rules and orders made thereunder.
13. In case this licence is cancelled during the currency of the period of licence or is not renewed on its expiry, the licensee shall forthwith intimate the whole stock of foreign liquor held in balance at the Bonded Warehouse to the Officer Incharge and dispose off only under the directions off only under the directions given by the Excise Commissioner.
